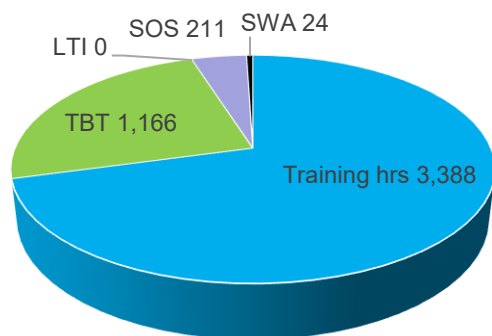

## WASTE MANAGEMENT





Every projects generate significant waste. Improper disposal creates environmental hazards, health risks for personnel, and legal non-compliance. All waste must be segregated at the source.

### Waste Classification:

Hazardous Waste	Non-Hazardous Waste
<b>Definition:</b> Liquid, solid, or gas that is toxic, corrosive, reactive, or flammable.	<b>Definition:</b> General industrial and domestic waste that does not pose an immediate health threat.
<b>Examples:</b> Cleaning fluids, lubricants, paints/dyes, used oil drums, and solvents.	<b>Examples:</b> Scrap metal, wooden pallets, plastic, cardboard, and food/garden waste.
<b>Action:</b> Handle per KEPA regulations.	<b>Action:</b> Handle per KEPA regulations.

### The Four Characteristics of Hazardous Waste:

Check for these labels before disposal:

-  **Ignitability:** Can it catch fire?
-  **Corrosivity:** Can it dissolve metal or burn skin?
-  **Reactivity:** Is it unstable or explosive?
-  **Toxicity:** Is it poisonous to humans or the environment?

### Mitigation & Reduction Measures:

**Substitution:** Where possible, replace hazardous chemicals with non-hazardous alternatives.

**Spill Prevention:** Ensure all drums are sealed and stored in banded areas to prevent soil contamination.

**Resource Conservation:** Reduce paper waste by using electronic filing and double-sided printing.

**Segregation:** Never mix hazardous chemicals with general domestic trash.

If waste is not disposed of according to standards, it triggers a chain reaction of negative consequences that affect the environment, the company, and your personal health. Here is what happens when waste management fails:

### 1. Environmental Contamination:

**Soil Poisoning:** Hazardous liquids like used oil or chemicals soak into the ground, killing local vegetation and making the land unusable for years.

**Groundwater Pollution:** Toxins can seep through the sand and reach underground water reservoirs (aquifers), contaminating the water supply.

**Air Toxicity:** Improperly stored chemicals or illegal burning of waste releases toxic fumes and greenhouse gases into the atmosphere.

### 2. Immediate Health & Safety Risks:

**Toxic Exposure:** Workers can suffer from skin burns, respiratory issues, or long-term illnesses if they come into contact with unsegregated hazardous waste.

**Fire & Explosion Hazards:** Mixing reactive chemicals or leaving flammable waste (like oily rags) near heat sources can lead to catastrophic site fires.

**Physical Injuries:** Improperly discarded scrap metal or wood creates trip and puncture hazards for everyone on site.

### 3. Operational & Legal Consequences:

**KEPA Fines & Penalties:** The Kuwait Environmental Protection Agency can impose massive financial penalties or even shut down project operations for environmental violations.

**Reputational Damage:** Reputation with clients and the government depends on maintaining a clean safety record. Major spills or "Environmental Incidents" can lead to the loss of future contracts.

**Increased Costs:** It is much more expensive to clean up a contaminated site (remediation) than it is to dispose of the waste correctly the first time.

### 4. Wildlife Impact:

In coastal or desert locations, improperly managed plastic and chemical waste can be ingested by local wildlife or marine life, leading to the death of animals and the disruption of the local ecosystem.
